Club of Santa Clarita Valley in Los Angeles County. During that time, he spent 15 months as the Interim Chief Executive Officer and led the organization through a challenging time when their long-time executive retired after 29 years.

Bryan brings a variety of experience in leadership, administration, program development, special events, fundraising, marketing, human resources, finances, advocacy, board development, innovation, and information technology.
